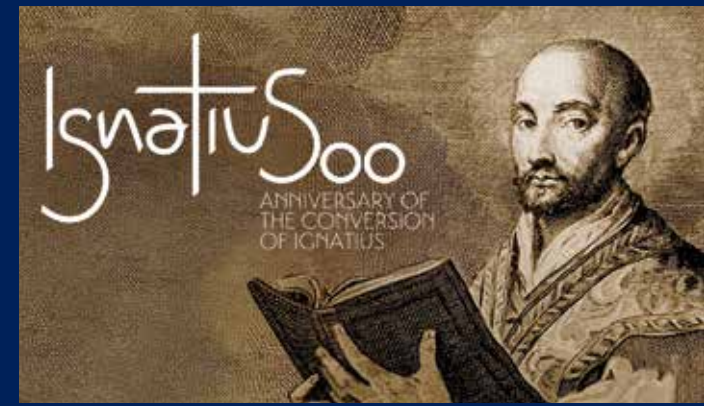
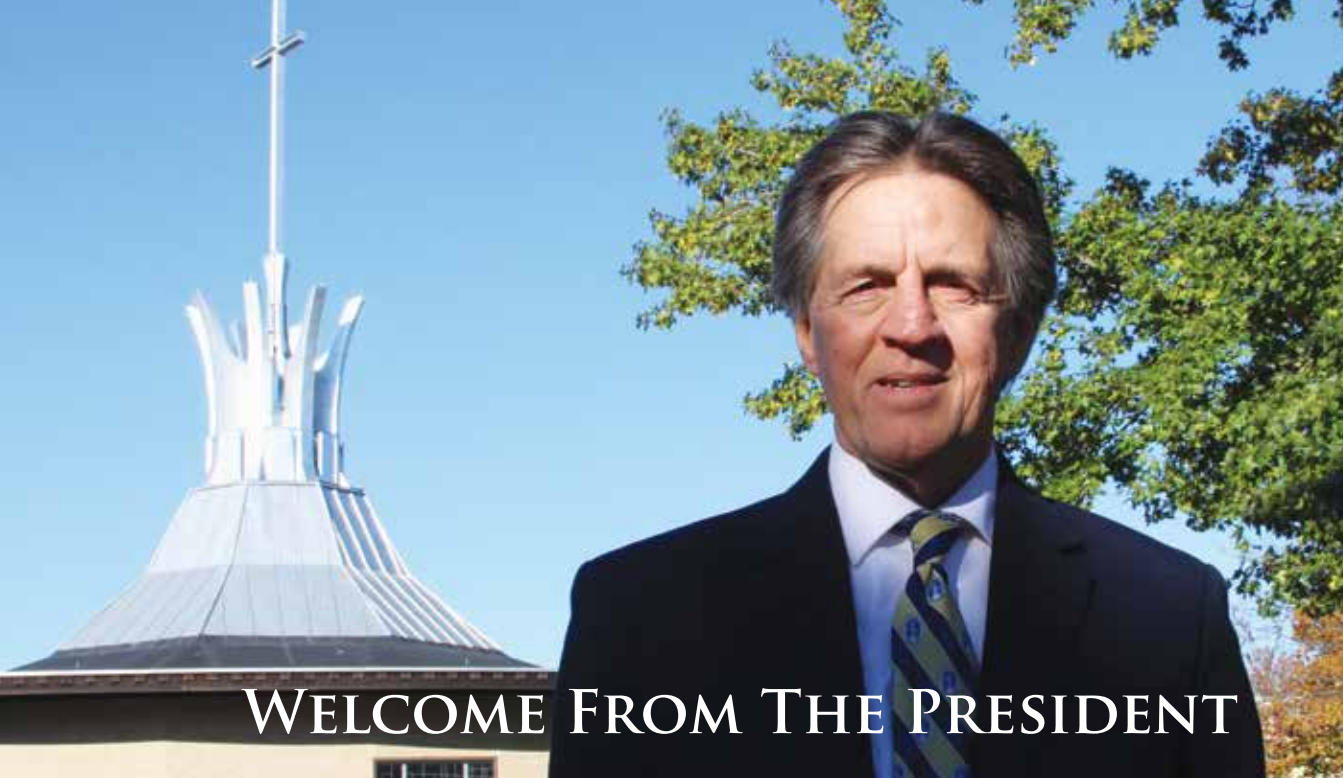

In addition to helping develop our students’ faith lives, retreats are student-led, which enhances leadership opportunities. The Athletic Department created the Czernicki Athletic Leadership Council in collaboration with the Chick-fil-A Leader Academy, another opportunity for student-athletes to be more fully challenged and a great example of the way every facet of student life rallies around one important goal: developing each Titan to his fullest potential.

Thank you for your part in making our mission of *Men for Others* possible. Because of your support, the transformation of heart and mind that happened to Ignatius 500 years ago is still happening today to young men from neighborhoods across northwest Ohio.

The 20/20 Jesuit Scholars Program afforded me opportunities that not only had a profound effect on my career path, but also on my life in general. Being primarily raised by a single

mother in east Toledo, I knew that funds were usually tight. Although we had been aware of the amazing opportunities that St. John's Jesuit could provide, we were not sure that financially it would ever be a possibility. Once I was accepted into the 20/20 Program, I knew that a goal that my mother and I had set when I was eight years old was accomplished. At 14 years old, I could never have imagined all the doors that attending St. John's would open. The 20/20 Program allowed me to participate in activities such as Christian Service, where I discovered my love for the field of special education from the work that I did at the Autism Model School. It provided me a chance to participate in

athletics that were not available in my local school district. This opportunity, combined with the ability to train under amazing coaches such as Todd Black, Keith Madaras, and Ryan Schoonmaker, allowed me to perform at a level that provided enough college scholarships that I was able to obtain a more than affordable undergraduate education and move towards a master's degree. When I unexpectedly lost my mother to lung cancer in the fall of 2013, it was the SJJ community that really rallied around me and allowed me to continue working toward all my goals.

One of the greatest indirect gifts that the 20/20 Program provided was my connection with the Kurtz Family (Andrew '13, Mike '85, and Vicki), who brought me into



their family during and after my mother's cancer battle and really guided me as one of their own children. Without this connection, even with the support of my amazing maternal family members, I am not sure that I would have been able to achieve my current career or any education past a bachelor's degree.

I will forever be grateful for all the ways that Coach Black helped me during my time at SJJ and afterward. Few people outside of Coach Black and Ms. Mary Ann Barabino have had such an amazing impact on my life, and I truly hope to have a similar effect on those I encounter throughout my career.

Endowed Scholarships: An Everlasting Impact

Supporters of St. John's Jesuit are often inspired to donate to the school in memory of someone special. SJJ's more than 150 named scholarships are witness to the tradition and incredible generosity of the community. Every gift made in memoriam has a story impacted by Catholic education and formed in the Jesuit tradition of *Men and Women for Others*.

THE TIM MALONE '69 SCHOLARSHIP

Tim Malone '69 passed into the loving arms of our Lord after a courageous fight against cancer in 2021. In the months since his passing, his family—wife Susan and sons Casey, Brendan '01, and Garrett '04—have established the Tim Malone '69 Scholarship to present to students who are most likely to benefit from a Jesuit education and embrace all that St. John's has to offer.

Malone lived a good part of his life at St. John's Jesuit, attending and later working at the school from 1965-2021. While these beginning and end dates are telling, it is the unassuming “dash between the dates” that represents so much more. Like a ripple in the water, Malone affected many by the way he lived out the mission of his Catholic faith. As a member of the first graduating class, Malone was a fiercely loyal Titan who embodied what it meant to be a *Man for Others* in every role he embraced. The impact he made as a student, a teacher, a mentor, a play director, a disciplinarian, an administrator, and a friend are his legacy at St. John's Jesuit. The outpouring of love at the time of his passing is a testament to the significance of the scholarship that his family has established in his memory.

“In my junior year, I was burnt out playing a sport every season and decided to take the year off from football. In Mr. Malone’s AP Government class one fall day, he asked if I ever thought of doing theater. The thought had never crossed my mind. So, I tried out for the fall play. I wasn’t a good actor. But Mr. Malone found a place for me. He asked if I wanted to student-direct the play. It was an awesome experience I will always remember and a testament to his inclusivity and creativity with developing students.”

“Mr. Malone was there for me when I stumbled and needed a steadying hand. He saw past my rough-hewn exterior with compassion and insight, stepped in to help keep me at SJJ, encouraged me to take responsibility for my actions, and never once made me feel like a screw-up. On the contrary, he signaled his belief in my potential. He did so quietly, with a gentle, understated touch. Only in retrospect did I come to appreciate the compassion as a person and the skill as an educator he displayed, as well as the great service he paid me.”

“I graduated from St. John’s Jesuit in 1989. At that time, Tim Malone was the associate principal, the top disciplinarian. He had the difficult job of seeing the unruliest five percent of students regularly, but there was no better person for that job. I remember many students who griped about Tim and feared him. But I never remember anyone feeling like he was unfair or a tyrant or bully. He was the kind of guy who could yell at you, and you would simultaneously know how much he cared about you. I know because I was on the wrong end of his tongue lashing once or twice. Tim was a bright, affable man with a great understanding of people. He could have had any number of other professions that would have been considerably more lucrative; instead, he was a lifelong educator who touched thousands of souls. He’ll be greatly missed.”

“In August 1965, more than 125 freshmen responded to a newspaper ad for a brand-new Jesuit school on Airport Highway, which was going to hold tryouts for its first football team at the Lucas County Recreation Center. I first met Tim Malone there.

The summer after our senior year at SJJ, Tim and I both got a job working for a truck line to make money for college. Our dads knew each other, and they thought this type of physical job would play a role in helping to make men out of us. So, Tim and I worked this incredibly horrible, make-a-man-out-of-you summer job. Tim was on the 8:00 p.m.-2:00 a.m. shift; I worked midnight-8:00 a.m. I was always jealous when I arrived for my shift because Tim was almost finished with his. He would be covered in sweat and grime and always had his head band on. He was an incredibly hard worker. The dock guys were “less than friendly” to high school/college kids. Tim and I both had grown out our hair during the summer—it was that era. The men on the dock told us one day we had better come in with haircuts or there would be trouble. I got my hair cut GI Joe-style on the spot. Not Tim, though—he stood strong. He knew he was right and would not be intimidated. To me, that was a template for Tim Malone’s life; when he knew he was right in a situation, any situation, he stood his ground.”

“Whatever role Tim was filling throughout his career—teacher, director, moderator, coach, assistant principal, principal—was irrelevant to those he encountered each day. He treated every student with respect, kindness, compassion, and empathy without judgement or anger.”

We worked like one director sometimes, almost reading each other’s minds; at other times, he saw the forest while I saw the trees. He always considered my contributions in directing...it was obvious how much Tim cared for the students and enjoyed interacting with them.”

“Mentor, colleague, friend—that was Tim Malone to me and to many others. I always admired the way Tim put people at ease and earned their trust. He was never too busy to actively listen. He was above all a teacher and a learner, and he also had a great love of history, theater, and the cinema. He enjoyed being in the classroom and sharing the excitement of learning with his students. Like the Pied Piper, Tim pulled his students into his subject despite the hesitation by some to think history was interesting. He was simply pure magic!”

“Tim was the most influential teacher in my life well before I was ever in his class. He was my director in our fall plays, a man who intentionally created community out of an “Island of Misfit Toys,” guys who didn’t necessarily fit into a lot of other places. Those guys are still my tribe today. As a student in college, I shadowed Tim and I started to grasp what he was teaching, what he’d always been teaching. Tim was teaching how to live; history and drama were just vehicles for those lessons.”

ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIPS

ANN KLEBAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP



Dan Kleban '95 recently established a scholarship to assist St. John's Jesuit families who have experienced a traumatic situation during their time at SJJ. "The only parameters I have placed on this scholarship is that the funds be used by scholars who fall upon unexpected challenging times and, by extension, are experiencing financial hardship," Kleban said.

Kleban's mother, Ann, died when Dan was a junior, and the SJJ community rallied around him and his family. "SJJ never sent me a tuition bill for the rest of my time there. My hope is that this scholarship helps repay that debt," Kleban said.

Four families have benefited from the scholarship in its first year. The French family (Andrew '23) lost their home and possessions in a house fire around the 2021 holidays.

"We never imagined what devastation a fire could bring to a family. When life suddenly became filled with uncertainties, it was such a blessing to receive a phone call from Mr. Knight telling us of this wonderful gift to help with Andrew's tuition. It was such a weight lifted from us knowing that Andrew would be able to continue at St. John's and have that safety net and consistency when everything else in our world was filled with questions. We feel so blessed by the generosity that has surrounded us through this difficult time," Kelly French, Andrew's mother, said.

Kleban said, "My motivation for attending SJJ was initially just to play soccer (but my mother had other motives, I am sure!). In hindsight, SJJ provided me so much more than top-level athletics. I carry with me today, and try to live out, the *Men for Others* creed. I graduated from the University of Southern Maine with a bachelor's degree in Political Science; I then graduated from Boston College Law School. Today, I am a 'recovering attorney' and own a craft brewery, Maine Beer Company, in Freeport, Maine, where I live with my wife and 10-year-old twins."

Kleban honored his mother by naming the scholarship after her because of her lifelong example of helping others who experienced hardships. "My mother, a devout Catholic and social worker by training, was a firm believer in helping those experiencing hardship. She instilled that charitable spirit in all her kids. I am fortunate to be in a place where I can honor her legacy of caring and compassion by providing support to SJJ students who fall upon unexpected hard times."

THE CHERYL HEINTSCHEL SCHOLARSHIP

Recognized at the 2021 Hall of Fame Ceremony



St. John's Jesuit named only one recipient to the 2021 Hall of Fame: Ed Heintschel, justifiably an honoree in a class all his own. The ceremony was held on December 3 before the SJJ basketball game at University of Toledo's Savage Arena. Heintschel was surrounded by family and friends, former players, and colleagues. On this special night, he dedicated all ticket proceeds to the scholarship established in the name of his wife, Cheryl, who passed away in 2002 after a three-year battle with breast cancer. She was a fiercely loyal supporter of St. John's Jesuit and her husband. She was the ideal coach's wife, who balanced work and family while dealing with a hectic schedule.



Heintschel was hired in 1974 to teach English and coach freshman football and JV basketball. Heintschel, who never expected to stay long-term, spent a 43-year career at SJJ. He taught English in the high school and eventually in the Academy. He served as a high school counselor from 2000–2017. In 1979, he was appointed Athletic Director as well as head varsity basketball coach, and he committed his career to building an athletic program—and specifically a Titan basketball program—that has earned him the respect and accolades of colleagues, players, and fellow competitors.

In total, Heintschel amassed a 725-224 record and a .764 winning percentage during 40 seasons. Upon his retirement in 2019, he finished his career ranked fourth in All Time Wins in Ohio and the only coach in the state to accumulate 700+ wins at one institution at the Division I level. More important than anything found in the record book, however, is the guidance and mentorship Heintschel provided to Titans both on and off the court. A true *Man for Others*, Heintschel's time at St. John's Jesuit as a teacher, counselor, administrator, and coach, as well as the financial support he now gives to students through the Cheryl Heintschel Scholarship, will bear fruit for years to come.

Planned giving may come through several methods, including charitable bequests, annuities, stocks, life insurance policies, retirement plan assets, charitable trusts, and Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs). The Advancement Office at SJJ advises prospective donors to first consult with an attorney, accountant, or wealth planning professional to explore all the options. The Advancement Office will work diligently to make the process simple and transparent by initiating the gifting agreement with a simple form, known as a nonbinding "Letter of Intent."

The bottom line was that, in the definition of “Jesuit,” the encyclopedia highlighted the word “education” more than once, and that was the operative word to me—that, and the fact that the Jesuits had a more liberal attitude towards education and encouraged independent thought! Where do I sign up?

The reason that education has always meant so much to me is that the '60s and '70s, when I was growing up, was a relatively tumultuous time to come of age in this nation's history—assassinations, war, riots, protests—there was never a dull moment, and that presented challenges to a kid! At times it was difficult, but, to me, getting an education was the key to a future, and that is what I was afforded at St. John's—a terrific education that taught me how to think!

Fast forward 55 years and my mindset can be summed up as follows: If I can assist in some small way helping a less fortunate child pursue his or her education and making life just a little bit easier by helping with financial educational needs, then I've achieved one of my life's goals—the opportunity to give something back and hopefully provide that opportunity in perpetuity for students at St. John's Jesuit! ”

Year Ten for the Toledo Labre Program Sparks a Spinoff



October 2021 signified the start of the tenth year of the Toledo Labre program at SJJ. The program was founded at St. Ignatius High School in Cleveland in 2002, before being brought to SJJ by Phil Skeldon in 2012.

In a program format that Skeldon established with Mark Dubielak '84, students at St. John's and St. Ursula Academy prepare meals after school every Monday. Once food is ready for delivery, students focus on the important work of Labre through prayer. The goal every week is to feed the hearts and minds of those in need as much as the body.

"Locations may change over time, but the impact of helping others does not," Director of SJJ Adult Formation Kim Hall said. In fact, students come to understand that food can be used to start a conversation with someone. Many people encountered on Labre trips are excited for the opportunity to share a story or have a friendly conversation with students.

"I love Labre," Director of Christian Service Richard Maume said. "In my new role, I have already formed relationships with the people we see week after week. These relationships make it not just about handing out sandwiches and chips, but also about talking to and checking in with people to see how they are doing and how we can assist them."

The formula for Christian Service has been so well received by the community that a supplemental Toledo Latino Labre program has been established. In a similar way, Spanish-speaking students prepare and deliver meals at Sts. Peter and Paul Parish. This new monthly tradition was launched in the church parking lot by Ricardo Amezcuita-Cadavid '22, Paul Thaman '22, Ernesto Carmona '22, Thomas Steigauf '22, and Anthony Syeh '22. With guidance from World Language Department faculty Ariela Paula and Claudio Cabrera, students connected with several Hispanic-speaking families through food and conversation.

COLLEGE AND CAREER COUNSELING SIGNIFICANTLY ENHANCED

Through donor support, SJJ has implemented a new high school career exploration program for the 2021- 2022 school year. Modeled after Jesuit principles, the program, known as The Chosen Path, takes the student through a four-year process that begins in freshman year with a personality inventory and assessment, as well as opportunities to engage with speakers who represent various professions. Sophomores participate in Vocations Day, an informational school-day event dedicated to hosting alumni and professionals in many fields. As juniors, students connect with career mentors and take a required nine-week college prep course with a focus on building an effective college portfolio, researching colleges and universities, creating a resume, writing an effective college application essay, and investigating opportunities in the job market. As seniors, students build on the mentor relationships of junior year with the option to pursue an internship aligned with career interests. Ultimately, those students who choose the internship path can graduate with the accolade of the “Ohio Means Jobs” career-readiness seal on his diploma. This recognition demonstrates to colleges and employers that a Titan is career-ready upon graduation.

Mrs. Rachel Swavel is new to St. John's this year. She has joined the College and Career Counseling Office as a Career Counselor, and she is the dedicated administrator for the program. “St. John's is quite remarkable in the way its learning environment promotes so many opportunities for personal growth, connection, brotherhood, and, ultimately, service to others. My hope is that this individualized program can be one more avenue that really allows our students to stretch and grow, find connections in their field, and ignite their passion to serve others with their 'Chosen Path.'”

Standing the Test of Time

The practice of being a *Man for Others* is deeply rooted in generations of Titans. From one graduating class to another, the gift of a Jesuit education grows and thrives, in part because alumni and alumni families are passionate about sharing the gift, steadfast in passing on the traditions.

Financial support for longevity is often celebrated when significant contributions trigger a visible change on campus or enable a new initiative to take shape. However, an equally important kind of donor likes to fly under the radar. Such supporters are the pillars of the SJJ community because their commitment has been reliable for 30 or more years—at whatever level possible—to advance the mission of St. John's Jesuit.

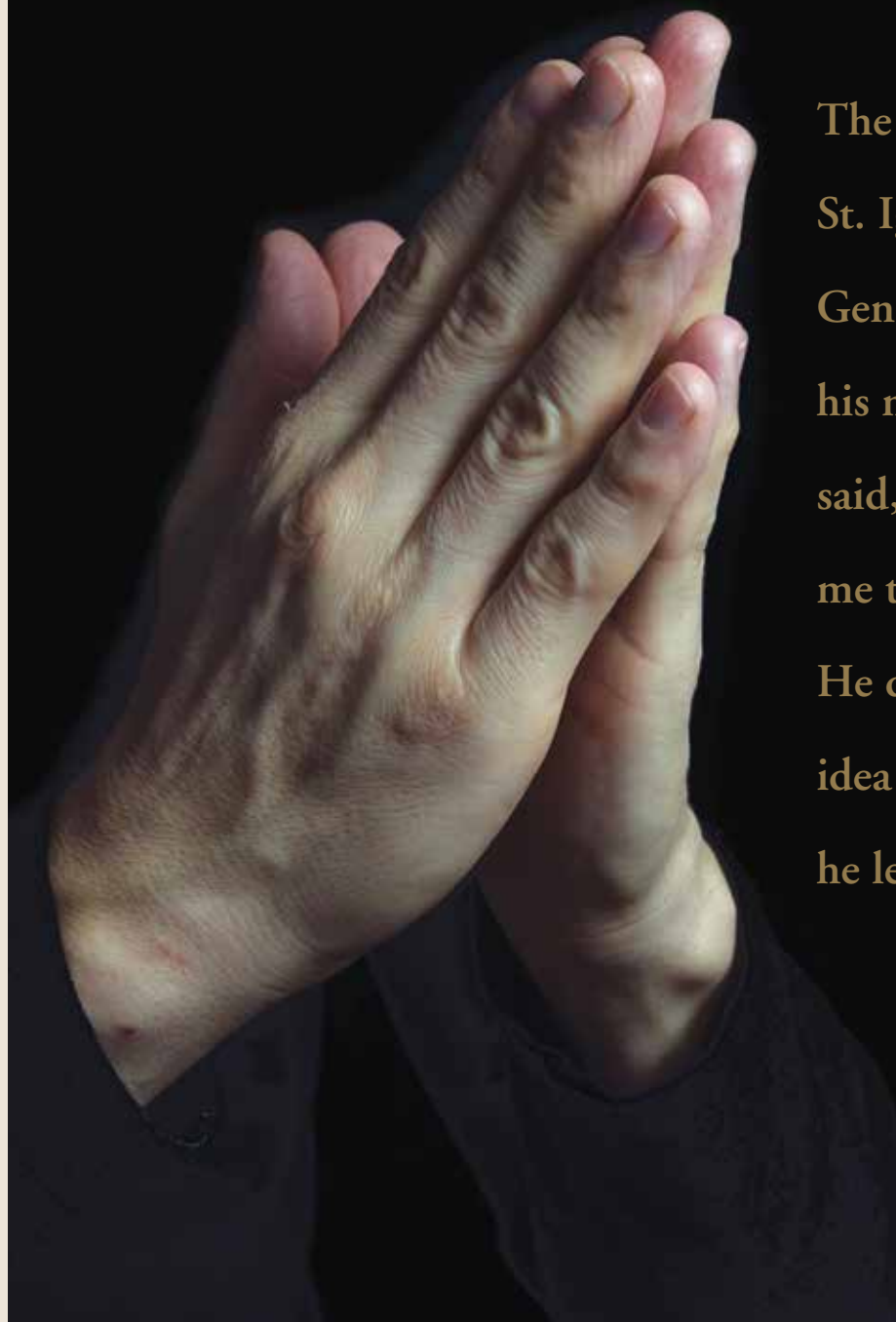

ACADEMIC INITIATIVES

The Time is Right for the Business and Entrepreneurship Program

Attracting and retaining academically talented students requires constantly evaluating curriculum and assessing student needs as they graduate into an ever-changing job market. Financial support for forward-thinking academic initiatives is vital and requires a leap of faith in school leadership. In 2018, SJJ created the Business and Entrepreneurship Program (BEP); the program's vision is a series of offerings that develops a deeper understanding of financial markets; teaches money management, collaboration, and strategic thinking; and provides hands-on learning opportunities to develop an idea supported by a business plan. As part of the BEP, students recently launched the first student-run business, the Titan Café. Dean of Academics Kari Bonnell is hopeful that the

Titan Café will be the first of many student-run ventures that allows for the hand-on experience that is critical to the impact of the class. "Education can so often be intangible. We learn facts, formulas, theories, things that make sense on paper. These students have moved to the next level. As educators, we often don't get to see the fruits of the intangibles taught in the classroom until our alumni come back and tell us ways they are using the information in their careers. But with the opening of the Titan Café, we can observe the learning process in real time, and it's wonderful."

ENTREPRENEURSHIP CLASS OPENS THE TITAN CAFÉ

The Titan Café began as a fundraiser to raise money for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society's "Student of the Year" campaign during the 2019-20 school year led by Mina Youssef '20. In 2021, it morphed into an independent study as part of the Business and Entrepreneurship Program (BEP), focused primarily on student-led entrepreneurship. The class consists of seven students who have been meeting since August before the start of the school day under the guidance of faculty advisor Phil Anthony. In the first weeks of class, students researched and identified tasks to fine-tune the existing menu and pricing. As a group, the students determined the responsibilities and roles of running a small business based on interest and skillset. The next step was to collaborate on a business plan, visit local cafés to appreciate the aesthetics of the atmosphere, and obtain a better understanding of space and placement.

As excitement began building in the fall, the group had to overcome several obstacles, including sourcing supplies, identifying the best portion size for various drinks, and selecting equipment. A soft opening provided an important



learning curve. Anthony said, "Our baristas had a big rush and had to manage a huge line. They did exceptionally well, given it was their first experience. After the event, we all debriefed and talked about areas of strength and areas of improvement."

The official grand opening of the Titan Café was January 31, 2022. Titan Café's first customers were BEP supporters Jamie '90 and Christine Happ. Students, faculty, and staff gathered to celebrate the milestone with a blessing and ribbon-cutting ceremony. As one of the first significant donors to BEP, Happ said, "We have chosen to support the Business and Entrepreneurship Program so that when the young men of northwest Ohio make their high school choice, they see that St. John's is not just another school. It's different...more forward thinking. Being an entrepreneur is a life skillset that melds perfectly into the breakneck speed of today's world, whether one wants to be in business or, frankly, any other occupation."

The BEP attracted the attention of alumni like Happ who want to see the program continue to grow. Now that the Café is open, Anthony says the students will assess the market and continue to look for ways to differentiate through a unique brand identity, promotional efforts, aesthetics, and menu offerings. "The course objective is for students to gain skills in budgeting, managing, and problem-solving through real life experience. This independent study requires dedicated and motivated students who show up early to school to prep the café and ensure success. The life skills that they are gaining will help them with job readiness skills, while simultaneously building self-confidence in budgeting, understanding consumer-driven markets, managing money, and exploring the world of customer service."

Since 2018, the Young Alumni Council (YAC) has steadily grown in membership and importance to the future of St. John’s Jesuit. Four years later, nearly every leadership committee of the Board of Trustees values the input and representation of more recent graduates. Many members of YAC embrace the opportunity to be closely connected to decision-making that will affect future Titans. Common to all members is a deep love for their student experience, as well as gratitude for the mission of Jesuit education.

To participate as a member of the Young Alumni Council, graduates must not exceed age 40 and

pledge a gift at the President’s Council level, which is \$1,500 per year for four years. The group meets quarterly, but is also called upon to support activities of the Office of Admissions, the Office of College and Career Counseling, and Senior Projects. Members receive the same benefits as those of the President’s Council. These men intend to be stakeholders in the school now and for years to come.

Young Alumni Fellowship Launched

The Barabino Jesuit Alumni Fellowship (BJAF) was created in 2020 to identify alumni of color who would benefit from tuition assistance in connection with acquiring a graduate degree in the areas of education, technology, marketing and communications, or other fields that directly relate to the day-to-day operations of St. John’s Jesuit. In addition, the BJAF was implemented to create a Titan faculty and staff that more closely reflects the diversity of the student body. The award is named after the long-time Director of the 20/20 Jesuit Scholars Program, Mrs. Mary Ann Barabino. Annually, the BJAF will search for an SJJ graduate who is a person of color and is currently in undergraduate studies,

progressing toward a degree. The recipient of the BJAF receives a \$5,000 scholarship for four consecutive years of studies. In accepting the award, he must return to SJJ as a paid employee for a minimum of two years in a position relating to his degree.

In the fall of 2021, St. John’s Jesuit proudly named Eliyon Johnson '19 as the first recipient of the BJAF. As a student in high school, Johnson was on the football, track and field, and basketball teams; he was also a member of the Spanish National Honor Society, Ambassadors, and the Christian

Service program. Johnson enjoyed his time as an Academy big brother, a retreat leader, and a Labre volunteer. Since graduating, Johnson has enrolled at the University of Toledo and is currently studying exercise science with a concentration in athletic training. After running track for four years at SJJ, he returned as an assistant track and field coach. Johnson takes his role as mentor seriously and enjoys working with current student athletes, according to head varsity coach Steve Spentoff '95. Long-term, Johnson would like to have his own physical therapy practice with a focus in working with athletes.

For now, Johnson is excited to be returning as a part of the Titan faculty upon graduating from UT next year. He hopes to help current and future students take advantage of opportunities presented to them, both at SJJ and beyond.

The new application period for the BJAF begins on September 1, 2022, and is open to all groups of color, which, for purposes of this program, are defined as, African-American, Hispanic American, Arab American, Native American, Asian American, and Multiracial. Titans Take It to the Next Level

Suiting up for the Bowling Green State University Men's Soccer team in the NCAA tournament this season were five St. John's Jesuit Titan alumni.

The quintet of Titans, headlined by All-Mid-American Conference (MAC) midfielder Zach Buescher '17, includes midfielder Kale Nichols '18, forwards Eli Shope '19 and Abdi Faqi '19, and defender Joey Akpunonu '20.

The Falcons went 11-6-3 this season while making a trip to the NCAA Tournament for the second year in a row. Before 2020, the Falcons had not reached the tournament since 1997.

"The aspect that attracts me most to SJJ athletes is their character," Eric Nichols, BGSU Soccer Coach and father of Kale, said. "It's that character piece that really separates the guys we go hard for and the ones that we don't. Across the board, the guys coming from St. John's check that character box."

Buescher is the all-time leader in games played and games started at BGSU, according to BGSU Soccer Sports Information Director Jason Knavel.



Since coming to BGSU as a freshman, Buescher has started in all 87 matches he has played, compiling 14 points.

"I think the environment at St. John's, playing with great players—especially when I was an underclassman—showed me what I needed to do to be able to succeed at the next level," Buescher said. "SJJ prepared me to become a better person. I am forever grateful that I was able to attend school there."

"It's no accident that we have five players from one school and not more than one from any others," Nichols said. "We look for this elite type of character, and St. John's Jesuit is cranking them out in droves."

Akpunonu earned Second Team All-Ohio honors, while Nichols was named to the Academic All-Ohio First Team. Nichols and Faqi also earned Academic All-MAC team selections this season.

"Everyone who competes at that level is going to be gifted physically; however, when I coached Zach and Joey, they had a willingness to be the hardest worker and set the standards for other players," current St. John's Jesuit soccer coach Greg McElroy '87 said.

McElroy coached Buescher with Pacesetter Soccer Club from a young age and has seen his game progress over the years.

"It's so fulfilling as a coach to watch a player reach what you think is his full potential," McElroy said.

Next season, Nichols, Shope, Faqi, and Akpunonu will all return to the Falcons roster, hoping to reach the NCAA tournament for the third straight year.

Titans named as TRAC All Academic are student-athletes who meet each of the following three criteria: 1. must earn a varsity letter; 2. must be either a sophomore, junior, or senior; 3. must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above. SJJ takes great pride in the number of student-athletes who were recognized for the fall season.

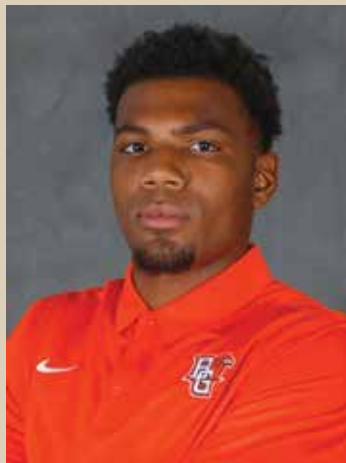

Time to Shine for Jaedyn McKinstry '21

Jaedyn McKinstry '21 was a standout football and basketball player at St. John's Jesuit before a freak moment changed everything.

In 2018, while playing AAU basketball, McKinstry got kneed in the groin, an injury that would end up saving his life.

"Those five seconds where I got kneed changed my entire life," McKinstry said.



The former Titan recently had an ESPN story produced about his battle with stage four Rhabdomyosarcoma, a rare cancer that affects muscle tissues. After the original diagnosis following his injury, McKinstry was told he had a 50 percent chance of survival. But he is a fighter.

He underwent 55 weeks of chemotherapy and radiation. In 2019, doctors declared Jaedyn cancer-free.

While his cancer was gone, so were his numerous college football scholarship offers. The athlete, who at one time looked like a lock to play at the highest levels of college football, accepted a preferred walk-on spot with Scot Loeffler and the Bowling Green State University football team.

After grinding all summer long, during a team meeting, the true freshman Falcon got a special message from his mother that he had earned a full scholarship at BGSU. McKinstry's teammates mobbed him and celebrated.

"I felt like a weight was really lifted off my shoulders," he said.

McKinstry played in 10 of BGSU's 12 contests this year, totaling three catches for 22 yards. He will return to the Falcons next year as a true sophomore, looking to take a big stride.

Winterfest 2021

For the second time in program history, St. John's Jesuit's hockey program participated in Winterfest, an outdoor hockey event hosted by the Toledo Walleye at Fifth Third Field in downtown Toledo. As the lead sponsor for the youth tournament, SJJ Hockey was strongly represented throughout the festivities of this two-week community event, including hosting St. Francis de Sales for High School Rival Night on December 22. More than 3,000 fans attended the game at Fifth Third Field in this unique opportunity for the team to play outside before a hometown crowd.

"For the players to experience playing hockey outdoors, the way the game used to be played, created a lifetime of memories," head varsity coach Derrick Stumm said.

The community stage provided more than just higher attendance. It allowed SJJ to serve the local hockey community by honoring Sylvania North Stars player Jackson Weis, who died in a tragic car accident in 2020. Weis was just 10 years old, but already identified by



many as a *Man for Others* in the making. More than \$1,500 was raised at the Winterfest High School Rival Night game for the Jackson Weis Foundation, a nonprofit established in Jackson's memory to provide financial assistance to kids in youth sports.
