### **Mission Statement**

St. John's Jesuit develops Christian leaders. As a Catholic school in the Jesuit tradition, we inspire each student to achieve his greatest potential in a diverse, Christ-centered atmosphere distinguished by academic success and service as a man for others. ST. JOHN'S JESUIT HIGH SCHOOL WAS FOUNDED IN 1868 and re-established in 1965 as a four-year, college preparatory high school for young men. In 2004, St. John's Jesuit established the Academy for seventh and eighth grade students, and in 2011, a sixth grade was added to the Academy. The school currently has an enrollment of 764 students, with 578 students attending the High School and 186 attending the Academy. Our students come from all socioeconomic backgrounds. Our student body is diverse, including 14% African American, 3% Asian, 8% Hispanic, and 13% multi-racial. St. John's Jesuit is a Catholic school; however, religious diversity is also present.

#### The Class of 2023

The Class of 2023 has 154 students. Acceptance to St. John's Jesuit is based upon criteria that includes admission placement test results, elementary and junior high school academic performance, and the recommendations of elementary and junior high teachers, counselors and principals.

# The Magis Society

The Magis Society is a selective program designed to invoke students' interest, passions, and talents. It begins with a rigorous application process before the freshman year and provides a four year framework consisting of curricular and enrichment experiences. A student's career in the Magis Society culminates in a personal Capstone Project which involves a tangible experience, a dissertation, a presentation, and an oral defense.

# **SJJ Faculty**

St. John's Jesuit High School & Academy has 64 faculty and administrative members who hold 4 doctorate degrees, 32 Master's degrees, and 28 Bachelor's degrees. The student to faculty/administrative ratio is 1:12.

# **Grade Point Average**

A student's GPA is calculated based upon all courses taken in high school, excluding physical education and the ACT prep course. The academic year is comprised of two semesters.

- Students are admitted selectively.
- · Students are not ranked.
- Advanced Placement and Honors courses require teacher approval based on stringent requirements and are weighted (AP = 1.0 Honors = .5 with a C or better).
- Approximately 96% of all St.
   John's Jesuit graduates continue their secondary education at colleges and universities.
- St. John's Jesuit does not report disciplinary history on either the transcript, or on the Secondary School Report.

# **COVID-19 Update**

St. John's Jesuit High School transitioned to full distance learning on March 16, 2020 through the end of the school year. The spring distance learning program provided regular college prep and advanced level class sessions using synchronous learning. To assist students with time management, classes pivoted to block scheduling. preserving the rigor of our college preparatory high school curriculum while maintaining the use of a traditional grading scale. End of the semester exams and service requirements were waived. School reconvened for the 2020-2021 school year on August 3, 2020. Classes are in person 5 full-days with the option of distanced, synchronous learning.

# 2022 -2023 St. John's Jesuit Curriculum

St. John's Jesuit is accredited by the State of Ohio, the Ohio Catholic Schools Accrediting Association, the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, and the Jesuit Schools Network. As a college-preparatory school, the curriculum prepares students for success in college.

The courses taken and the rigorous demands on students have proven to be the finest preparation for collegiate achievement.
